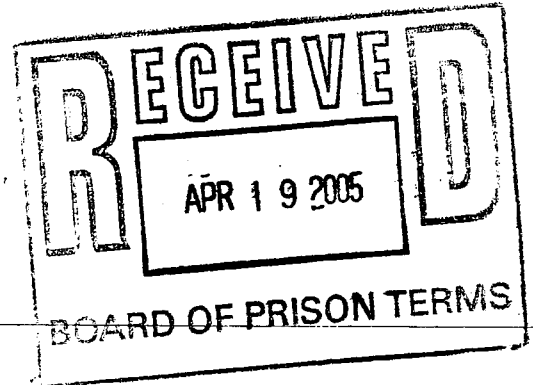


RE: Grant Parole to PF Lazor, C-73842

First, please know how stunned I am to hear that our young friend "PF" Lazor is still serving time in your prison system. For what was clearly an act of self-defense, "PF", as he always referred to himself, has already forfeited twenty-two precious years of his life - there is something dreadfully wrong here.

No one could ever convince me or my husband Glenn (passed away 11/10/02) that "PF" would willfully take a life without serious provocation or threat to his own. He loved life too much and was so excited about the future and all it held in store for him. Before he left for California, he lived with us for a couple of months and we got to know this multi-talented young man... he fitted right in with our seven children. Our eldest son was a classmate of his throughout high school. Top notch students they were with healthy interests in school debates, history, class plays and creative writing to mention a few.

I am 72 years old now and still very busy with community and church activities. As Detroit Province Director for the National Council of Catholic Women, I do a lot of travelling and so I hope that my letter arrives in time. It would do my heart good to see "PF" at my door real soon.

Please allow justice to prevail and give this man his freedom.
