RE: GRANT PAROLE TO PF LAZOR, C-73842

This letter is written in support of the granting of parole to PF Lazor.

I have become friends with PF Lazor through letter writing and visits. PF is an individual who cares about God and about being and doing what is right before his Creator. I am amazed at how well he manages to remain not only sane, but steadfastly upright, while enduring not only incarceration, but I believe wrongful incarceration. PF has been in prison in California for over 20 years. It is hard to believe that he has been continually denied parole.

There is much evidence to show that his "crime" was in necessary and indeed legal, self-defense, which results although unfortunate, could have been PF's demise instead of his attacker's. PF was free on bail during his trial and after his arrest and yet is repeatedly denied parole that is mandated by Penal Code Sec. 3041(b), unless one is considered a danger to society. He was obviously not known to be or considered to be any danger to society to have been allowed to be free on bail with no restrictions during that crucial time period. In fact, both the granting of his freedom as well as his behavior during that time prove to support the very reason he was allowed that freedom.

His main "crime" seems to be refusing to admit he is guilty of murder. He has been constantly harassed while in prison. His prison file contains information showing possible false reports were made against him. Many California prisoners have been convicted of first-degree murder and served less time. PF has never been violent and could again be a tremendous asset to his state and country if he were free.

I do pray and plead with your sense of fairness and equity as representatives of our justice system, in my sincere and urgent request to grant long overdue parole to PF Lazor. Please give him the opportunity to once again live in freedom as a law abiding citizen, giving to society during the remaining years of his life, instead of him continuing to be an unnecessary burden on the taxpayers of California.
