TO THE CALIFORNIA SUPREME COURT AND ALL CONCERNED PEOPLE:

I am writing this letter on behalf of my son, P.F. Lazor, who is being held in a prison in Tracy, California. This man's incarceration is the most flagrant miscarriage of justice that I have ever heard of. A review of the judicial proceedings, I think, will confirm this.

I will not go into any of the unbelievable events that went on at his so-called trial. This man's moral character and caliber is beyond question.

This young man was raised by his mother and me in a God loving and God fearing home. This boy was never in trouble at school or at home or with the law at any time.

We are looking at a very talented young man who is a first class artist, and who, after school, wrote two hard cover books, painted the logo on the dust cover, and had the books published by his own publishing house.

This same young man, before he was twenty, bought his own ice cream truck, and sold ice cream in South Lyon and Northville, Michigan. At the end of his run, he would go down a different street each day, and give away the left-over ice cream to the neighborhood kids for free!

Does that sound like a murderer to you?

I pray that this letter will reach everybody with a feeling of compassion and I pray that justice will ultimately prevail.
