This letter is in regard to an upcoming parole hearing.

I have known PF for twenty years, and consider him to be an asset to any to any community he would reside in. However, yours now is a legal question - so I urge you - even plead with you please, consider:

The court acknowledged:

The man PF shot was threatening to kill, broke into the house with violent force, and, was armed.

PLEASE NOTE: Penal Code § 198.5. In regard to this law, people all over California in homes, stores, etc. are NOT BEING CHARGED for shooting intruders; it is SELF DEFENSE.

Please note also that the California Legislature has said (Penal Code § 3041(b)) the BPT SHALL set a release date at the minimum early eligible date UNLESS the crime was so unusually heinous that a release would be a great danger to the public.

PLEASE CONSIDER, re the above:

AFTER hearing death threats, AFTER having his door kicked in "with VIOLENT force, Mr. Lazor:


- 1.) Fired a WARNING SHOT! (I dare say - I'm not sure I'd have "wasted that shot",
- 2.) CALLED for AMBULANCE and Police immediately. (- 45 seconds later; see court records.)
- 3.) Was out in front of his house, FLAGGING IN the Ambulance and Police vehicles.

Heinous?... Hmm... I think not. (I know not)

Please - it is, though it may ~~seem~~ sound lofty or idealistic, it is a detriment, a loss to society to have Mr. Lazor in prison.
