I have been a classroom English teacher since 1966. I have taught at South Lyon High School beginning in the Fall of 1970.

I have known P.F. Lazor since January 1971 when he was in my 9th grade English class. (He was called George in those days.) P.F. was taking the 2nd semester of 9th grade English. He impressed me as a unique and a maturing person.

P.F. was a serious and sincere student. He worked hard and was a leader in the class. We also discussed his feelings about conscientious objection --related to the Vietnam War, the draft, and to his feelings against war and violence.

After P.F. left my class we have remained in contact. He continues to be interested in many things especially the creative arts and acting. I haven't seen him often, but he phones to keep me aware of his successes and efforts. I've felt pleased to be viewed as a friend by him.

I believe P.F. is a good person and that violence would not be his first answer to any problem. He could respond to violence with violence for the sake of self-preservation, but I do believe that this would happen only if he honestly felt he had no other choice.
