To Whom it may concern:



He had already designed very innovative garments and accessories. I found him to be a very bright and creative young man with enormous enthusiasm for the pursuit of a variety of artistic expressions. I admired his sensitivity and his personal philosophy. He was a most sincere young man.

I resigned from my position on campus and joined our family business. P F stayed in contact by phone and correspondence as he pursued his career in music.

Time passed in our busy lives and I had not been in contact with P F for some time. He surprised me with a visit to our home and at that time told of the horrifying experience he had gone through at the time of the shooting incident. The months that followed have been extremely difficult for him.

I do not know all the details of that moment but I do know of P F Lazor's character. He remains a sensitive, warm and loving young man. He is a contributor to society, not a destroyer of society. I would plead for the justice system to recognize his fine qualities and allow him the freedom necessary to express them. Nothing and no one could possibly benefit by incarcerating him.
