TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:


This letter is written on behalf of Mr. P.F. Lazor who was my client for over one year at the California Medical Facility (Vacaville) from 1987 through 1988.

As a Staff Psychologist at CMF I saw Mr. Lazor on a regular basis where we were engaged in issues related to adjusting to incarceration. He demonstrated himself to be a reliable and hardworking client.

- In general, I see Mr. Lazor as a bright, honest man who's psychological problems were directly related to the effects and experience of being incarcerated. His preinstitutional adjustment was excellent and his character was widely considered to be outstanding. It seems to me that Mr. Lazor's emotional and behavioral difficulties were largely due to the conflict that would necessarily arise when a heretofore responsible citizen suddenly is required to conform to the incidious pathology of prison life, irrespective of his own culpability in the conviction offense.

I strongly believe that the chances of Mr. Lazor resuming a responsible, productive, and honest life are excellent if given the opportunity. I, for one, hope that time is soon.
