OPINION CONCERNING SONGWRITER, P.F. LAZOR

I've listened to Freeman Lazor sing over thirty of his original songs, a capella, and I'm astonished. Lazor writes not only #1 hit-songs material, but if you rated the #1-charted songs from 1-to-10, (10 being the best), Lazor writes consistent 10s. Whoever connects with his career, assuredly will find music industry success. This is music the public would buy — I am one of them, a mainstream music lover and consumer of various styles for over thirty years. And I'd buy it. I'd buy Lazor's songs before I'd buy most of today's other music being sold. It belongs on "Warehouse Records & Tapes" front counters and racks.

One of the astounding things about Lazor's music is that one person could have such phenomenal variety of styles and themes of hit song material, ranging from love songs, to jazz, pop, rock, country, R & B, easy listening, Christian/gospel, humor-novelty, political, and a great blues song that made me want to jump out of bed and move! Many successful hit songs by other artists, both old and current, make no sense to me. I've never before heard a songwriter-singer, even the most famous, so versatile and so consistent in their talent of writing quality hits, as is Freeman Lazor.


Lazor's songs are very intelligently written, with meaning I can relate to. They make sense - lyrically and musically. They bring sweet reminiscence & great memories, good feelings; seeming to reach universally as to touch any mood, to uplift, yet very personalized at the same time, reaching the depths of joy and sadness in one song. People can relate to Lazor's songs. On top of all else, his songs feel good; they make me feel good. Joy-inspiring.

While I do feel in his writing & singing, hints of the old enjoyable Buffalo Springfield, Hank Williams (Sr.), Willie Nelson, Harry Chapin, Tom T. Hall and other greats, the unique style and feeling is all Lazor's own, set apart from all the others, in great songs like "Hero All Alone," "Married To The Music," "A Gift To You," "Nothin Else Will Do," "So Pathetic-Copacetic Blues," and many others which I believe with certainty millions of music lovers the world over will relate to and buy for many years to come.
